NOAC 2024

The National Order of the Arrow Conference was held from July 29 to August 3 at the University of Colorado Boulder, and it was an awesome time!

Nguttitehen Lodge sent a contingent of 25 youth and adults to join 6,000 Arrowmen from across the world for a week of friendship, fellowship, service, training, and, most importantly, a whole lot of fun!



The trip started with an 18-hour bus ride from Pfeffer Scout Reservation to CU Boulder's campus. The ride had no shortage of fun, including narrating the first Shrek movie because the audio didn't work. It also included a stop at the Eagle Scout Memorial in Kansas City.





Upon getting to Colorado, the contingent was greeted with four days of training, recreation, and fellowship.

Each day presented a variety of different opportunities for our Arrowmen. From career panels for their future plans in life to learning about how to give back in various ways, whether that's transitioning to advising or becoming a commissioner. Of course, every lodge needs a refresher on how to update its website and how to use Lodgemaster effectively, so there were classes on those, too. There were also classes on starting to track or discover your lodge's history and how to present it properly.



Speaking of history, one of the biggest draws for NOAC is the Goodman Edson Observatory, which showcases the history of our Order.
